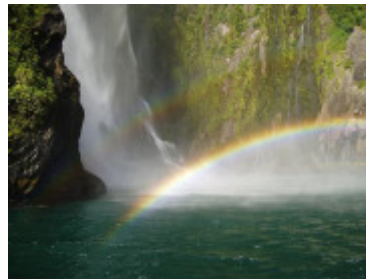

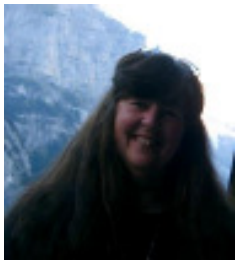

* **Fiordland** - Fiordland is New Zealand's largest national park at almost 3 million acres. It covers much of the southern part of the South Island's West Coast. The Sounds in Fiordland are arguably the most beautiful places in New Zealand, and that's saying something! Wildlife, waterfalls, unforested valleys, crystal clear lakes, and elegant mountains are what make up the views, and the only signs of human inhabitation are the tracks running deep into the bush, and the cruises down the sounds.

by volcanoes, lakes, parks and recreational areas, and is a great place to go hiking or to view native birds and animals

* Wai-o-tapu - geothermal area known for its brilliant colors - hot pools & Lady Knox Geyser

* **Whakarewarewa - The Living Thermal Village** - Set amidst a landscape of erupting geysers, hot thermal springs and bubbling mud pools, is the living village of Whakarewarewa. Experience the unique lifestyle of the Maori in a natural, Maori village setting. Whakarewarewa, where the Goddesses of fire, Te Pupu and Te Hoata, emerged from the earth's core, inhaling and exhaling, creating the geysers, hot springs and mud pools.

* **Hidden Valley of Orakei Korako** ("the place of adorning") - geothermal wonderland of gushing geysers & boiling mud pools

The Maori are the indigenous people of New Zealand. Their name is derived from Ma-Uri, which means Children of Heaven.

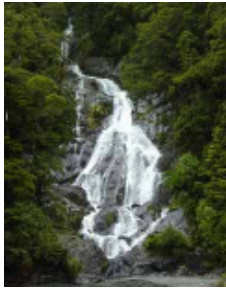


Tentative Itinerary - South Island

Day 1 - Arrive in Invercargill on south coast of the South Island after transferring on arrival in New Zealand at Auckland airport. From there we will travel to Te Anau ("cave with a current of swirling water"), on Lake Te Anau, in Fiordland. Rest and recover from jetlag. Overnight in Te Anau for next 2 nights

Day 2 - Day in Te Anau - travel by boat across the lake to a Glowworm cave - rediscovered in 1948 - a short underground boat ride, a glowworm grotto and waterfalls.

Day 3 - Free time in Te Anau - possible options (extra cost) are Fiordland National Park Visitor Centre, Te Anau Wildlife Centre, lake cruises, kayaking, jetboat rides past Lord of the Rings locations on the placid Waiau River, quad-biking in the high backcountry with stunning view of lakes, scenic helicopter or plane flights, horse riding, walks, biking, &/or shopping.



Day 4 - Travel to Milford Sound "Piopiotahi" (a fiord) - often referred to as "The Eighth Natural Wonder of the World". Fiordland is one of the wettest places in the world, and is as beautiful raining as it is with clear skies. When it rains, waterfalls spring up anywhere, too many to count. We will experience an incredible drive to Milford Sound, along Lake Te Anau, through Eglinton Valley, where the road penetrates into steeper bush-clad mountains, past Mirror Lake and winding through sub-alpine wonderland to bare rock walls for the seemingly impassable head of the Hollyford River. Then travel through the Homer Tunnel to the steep Cleddau Valley with "The Chasm - near vertical rapids; Humboldt Falls, a three-step cascade leaping some 200m and possibly the highest falls near a road in Australasia; and then straight down to Milford Sound. Milford Sound is the most northerly and most celebrated of Fiordland's 15 fiords with vertical sides towering 1200m above the sea and waterfalls plunging from hanging valleys. We will have a fascinating boat trip on the sound which includes visiting waterfalls, seal colonies, overhanging rock faces, viewing Mitre Peak and visiting Milford Deep Underwater Observatory consisting of a floating platform moored to a sheer rock with spiral staircase to a underwater gallery where windows look out on coral and plant species.

Overnight near the Sound or other area.

Day 5 - Travel to Queenstown or Wanaka, in a beautiful setting looking across Lake Wakatipu to the beautiful The Remarkables mountain range. (see below for some options for the afternoon and evening). Overnight in Queenstown or Wanaka for 2 nights.

Days 6 - Queenstown or Wanaka (depends on where we stay) - free day for options on your own (extra) - Scenic day tours by double decker bus; Bungy Jumping (area has 3 of the world's most gloriously scenic bungy sites); jetboat ride down Shotover River; whitewater rafting; river surging; whitewater sledging; canyoning; lake cruises; Walter Peak High Country Farm; scenic flights or hot air ballooning; gondola ride to Bob's Peak, wine tours, skydiving; tandem paragliding or hanggliding or skydiving; horse riding; Kiwi & Birdlife Park; Queenstown Gardens; Maori Hunting Village; or easy local walks.



Day 7 - Beautiful drive to Glenorchy at the top of the Lake and walks in the area. Free day, later afternoon for options above.

Day 8 - Travel from Queenstown or Wanaka to Aoraki Mt. Cook area - a National Park and World Heritage Site with 22 peaks over 3000m. Travel past Lake Pukaki, Peters Lookout to Aoraki Mt. Cook Village, in an encircling horseshoe of mountains. Overnight in Mt. Cook Village or elsewhere nearby.

Days 9 & 10 - Travel from Aoraki Mt. Cook Village area to Fox & Franz Josef Glaciers on the west coast. We will travel through rolling grasslands of central Otago, over Haast Pass, along the Haast River with churning cascades, visiting Thunder Creek Falls and Fantail Falls and Blue Pools Walk along the way. Then on down into verdant rain-soaked forests of the West Coast. Along the way we will see beautiful Bruce Bay (a long driftwood-strewn beach). Fox & Franz Josef Glaciers are the only glaciers in the world that descend into rainforest. Two rivers of ice cascading their way down towards the thick rainforest of the coastal plain. In this area the terrain drops from over 3000m to near sea level, within a few kilometres, bringing with it Franz

Josef glacier and Fox glacier, 2 of the largest and most impressive of the sixty-odd glaciers that are in the South Island. Easy walks to the glaciers (roped off) or view from Sentinel Rock. Day 11 here is free day - optional extras, on your own, here, are glacier hikes on the glacier, scenic flights or heli hikes. Also possibility for guided kayaking. Overnight for 2 nights in this area



Day 11 - Today we will travel north, up the west coast, to Hokitaka area for visit to Punakaiki and Pancake Rocks (beautiful unusual rock formations) in the Paparoa National Park. (Can end tour here - see Option D on Registration form). For those continuing on, on to Greymouth with its long heritage of greenstone carving (jade very important to the Maori) and up over the Lewis pass, through silver & red beech forest & on to the resort of Hanmer Springs, in the foothills of the Southern Alps. Here there are thermal pools at the Hanmer Spring Thermal Reserve beautiful forest

walks, mini-golf courses. Overnight in Hanmer Springs area.

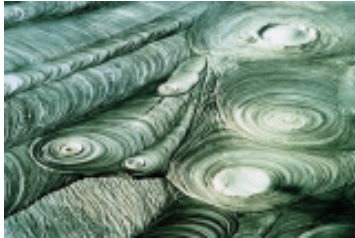
Days 12 & 13 - Later today, travel to Kaikoura, on the beautiful east coast for Whalewatching and swimming with dolphins (dusky dolphins) (weather dependent). The sea bed here drops rapidly to the Hikurangi Trench of the Kaikoura Canyon - 1000m deep, 1 km from the land. This brings sea mammals

in large quantities because this feature funnels warm sub-tropical waters and cold sub-Antarctic flows into a nutrient rich upwelling providing an unusually rich habitat supporting an enormous amount and variety of marine life - an easy meal for marine mammals. Giant sperm whales and dolphins are seen all year. Possible options here are a 2-hour whale watching boat tour (weather and whale presence dependent) or a 3-hour Dolphin Encounter tour (dolphin swimming with and/or watching) (weather and dolphin presence dependent). Dusky dolphins are very gregarious and highly social, living together in groups called pods, which in the Kaikoura region can consist of individuals numbering anywhere from 100 to 800 in each pod. In autumn and winter, pod sizes can even be greater, sometimes numbering in the thousands. For this reason, Kaikoura is recognised as one of the best places in the world to regularly encounter wild dolphins in their natural environment. The dusky dolphins are reputed to be amongst the most acrobatic of the dolphin species, and their spectacular leaps, jumps, side slaps and back flips, bring shouts of joy to most that go out to witness their wild and free behaviour. One of the most spectacular leaps performed by the dusksies is its trademark somersault and the dusksies will often repeat these acrobatic leaps time and again.



Day 14 - Possible Maori Tour (depending on timing and availability) - We will be part of a real cultural exchange, widely acknowledged as one of the world's finest indigenous tours, where we will gain a deep insight and understanding of the Maori way of life and spiritual connection to the environment - a personal and intimate journey into the Maori world. Kaikoura is an area of immense natural beauty and rich Maori history. We will visit some of their special places and they will introduce us to them through their eyes and share the secrets of the landscape. The stories of their ancestors will echo through the voices of today; stories that will leave us smiling and amazed. Throughout the journey we will have a chance to join in their customs and learn their ways. Try weaving with the native harakeke (flax) plant and learn a song written especially for us by one of their family members and much more. This will also include a visit to Kaikoura's bush walkways where we'll get the chance to explore traditional uses of trees and plants as food and medicine. As more than 90% of New Zealand's native bush is endemic we will be delighted to be in a landscape found nowhere else in the natural world. Overnight in Kaikoura area 2 or 3 nights.

Day 15 - Tour ends today. To Christchurch airport for flights home or continue with us to the north island or on your own.



Tentative Itinerary - North Island

Day 1 - Arrive North Island and travel to Rotorua, Spa City of the South Pacific & the heartland of New Zealand's Maori culture. Rotorua is a smallish city on the shores of Lake Rotorua. Rotorua is also a showcase of Maori cultural activities, a centre of tourism and a place of extraordinary natural beauty. This afternoon we will travel to Taupo region - **Lake Taupo & the Hidden Valley of Orakei Korako** - geothermal wonderland of gushing geysers & boiling mud pools. More Maori legends as we travel.



Day 3 - This morning we will travel to Whakarewarewa - The Living Thermal Village & Te Puia - Set amidst a landscape of erupting geysers, hot thermal springs and bubbling mud pools, is the living village of Whakarewarewa. Experience the unique lifestyle of their people in a natural, Maori village setting. Concert & guided tour.



Day 4 - Free Day in Rotorua area - possible options, on your own (extra cost), are:

- * Botanical gardens
- * Rotorua Museum, located in the former bathhouse in the formal Government Gardens - fine collection of Maori artefacts and bathhouse relics
- * Boat trip out to Mokoia Island - hot pool & bird sanctuary & known for the story of Hinemoa & Tutanekai, the greatest of all Maori love stories
- * Visit the Polynesian Spa, a mostly open-air complex landscaped for lake views, with 3 separate areas - 35 hot mineral pools, private pools or adjacent Lake Spa Retreat with landscaped shallow rock pools of differing temperatures along with private relaxation



lounge and bar and enormous range of massage, body scrubs, mud wraps and more.

* Travel to nearby Hell's Gate Geothermal area & Wai Ora Spa - Hell's Gate has semi private mud baths with a very open spa area overlooking the thermal park. Wai Ora has private mud baths with an open spa that is secluded and set apart from the rest of the complex.



Lots of possibilities for your free day, on your own in Rotorua. Gather tonight for dinner together.



Day 5 - Travel back to Auckland airport area for flights home on Day 6, or continue on your own.

As of September 2018, the Dollar is at \$1.50 NZ\$ per \$1 US

II. Included: Price includes (see registration form on last page for prices):

Option A - 14 nights accommodations, South Island only - twin/triple rooms in Bed & Breakfast or Motel or Hotel; all breakfasts, transportation from Invercargill airport at beginning of trip by minibus (must coordinate arrival time with us); to Christchurch airport at end of trip & transportation throughout tour; admission to sites listed; all workshops. Single room extra cost.

Optional Extension to Option A above - 5 nights accommodations, North Island only - twin/triple rooms in Bed & Breakfast or Motel or Hotel; all breakfasts; transportation from Rotarua airport at beginning of trip by minibus (must coordinate arrival time with us); to Auckland airport at end of trip & transportation throughout tour; admission to sites listed; all workshops. Single room extra cost.

Option B - South Island Only - 11 nights accommodations, South Island (partial trip - leaving the group on Day 11 for flights back to Auckland from Hokitaka area on own) - twin/triple rooms; in Bed & Breakfast or Motel or Hotel; all breakfasts, transportation from Invercargill airport at beginning of trip by minibus (must coordinate arrival time with us); to Hokitaka airport area motel at end of trip & transportation throughout tour; admission to sites listed; all workshops. 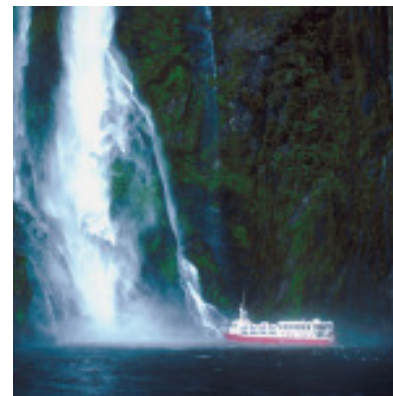
